GBHS gave a 10-year Annual Report showing how your donations have dramatically improved outcomes for animals in our community.

Overcomers

Nobody thought a shelter in our state could achieve the gains we have - but your support has shown we can make positive change for animals.

A RECORD NUMBER OF ANIMALS SERVED AND DECREASED INTAKE

- 140,000 abused, lost, and neglected animals received rescue, response, and veterinary care 24/7
- 30% overall decreased intake as a result of aggressive TNVR, reclaim, and surrender prevention programs



THE LARGEST TRAP, NEUTER, VACCINATE & RETURN PROGRAM IN ALABAMA

- 8,000+ cats spayed/neutered, vaccinated, and returned to their communities
- 41% increase in feline live release rate



CRITICAL SUPPORT FOR RURAL SHELTERS AND RESCUE PARTNERS

 GBHS is now a regional shelter with a 7,500-sf warehouse that provides pet food, supplies, and medicines to multiple county impoundment facilities, rural and local rescues, and pet owners at risk of losing their pets.

RECORD BREAKING NUMBER OF SPAY/NEUTER SURGERIES

- •50,000+ spay/neuter surgeries performed at the GBHS hospital; 62,000 total spay/neuter surgeries since 2012.
- 900+ Auburn and Tuskegee vet students trained
- •80+ rescues served on average annually, and approximately 8,000 pet owners provided veterinary care and spay/neuter surgery

RECORD TRANSPORTS

- 9,053 lives saved. 342 transport trips
- 77,000 average miles driven each year by volunteers
- \$199 average cost per pet
- . \$664,000 cost of gas, vehicles, and vehicle maintenance
- 2 transports in 2012 to 85 per year today



THE LARGEST DISASTER/CRISIS RESPONSE UNIT IN THE SOUTHEAST

- We sit on the county EMA board and respond to natural and manmade disasters, CBHS provides: an EMA Vet Trailer; Trained Field Personnel; Supplies and Medicines for Dislocated Pet Owners, Shelters, and Rescues; Evacuation of all Pets; Crime Scene Processing; Investigation Assistance; Vet Care; and Expert Tastimony.
- 11 hurricane responses and the evacuation of more than 570 animals
- 50+ hurricane impacted shelters and rescues assisted
- GBHS served 235 pets, 521 pet owners, and 70 shelters impacted by tornadoes and wind
